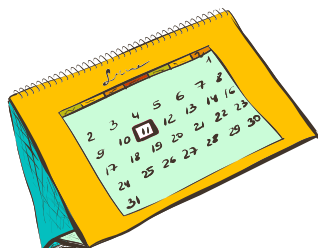

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COLLABORATE

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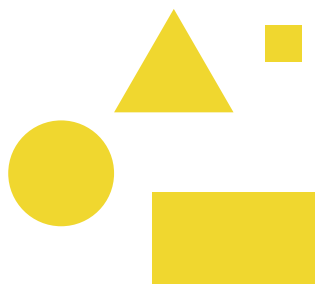
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The team chooses one word and mimes it for the rest of the class to guess what it is.

Computer, chair, scissors.

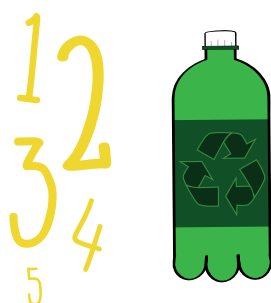
