## The original 'derby'

More than 1,000 years ago, there was an unusual game in the UK. It was the origin of modern football. The game was very typical during the Shrovetide carnival in February.

Today is February 13th. It's 2 p.m. in Ashbourne in the UK. Ashbourne is near the city of Derby, so we get the word 'derby' from this place. Two local teams meet in the town and play 'Shrovetide football'. There are hundreds of people in each team. Players can run, jump and push!
