- 3 Kelly is going to the sports centre. She's wearing her tracksuit and her baseball boots.
- 4 John's dad always looks smart. He works in a bank and he usually wears a suit and a tie.
- 5 Holly likes wearing casual, comfortable clothes. She doesn't like tights – she prefers leggings, and she often wears a long top over them.
- 6 Kelly's uncle never wears jeans and he doesn't wear casual clothes. His favourite clothes are his waistcoat and his tie. It's a bright, patterned tie and it looks funny!

- 2 (girl) It's Jake's party on Saturday. What are you going to wear?
(boy) Well, Jake said we should wear casual clothes, so I'm going to wear my baggy jeans and my striped T-shirt.
(girl) Cool!
- 3 (teacher) Don't forget that you must look smart at the school prize day tomorrow. You must wear your full school uniform, including your plain shirt and your striped tie.
- 4 (girl) I can't wait for the holidays. I'm going skiing!
(man) Do you need special warm clothes?
(girl) Yes, it gets really cold. I've got a new flowery jacket. It's very warm. I also wear tight trousers. I don't wear baggy clothes because they aren't warm enough.
- 5 (teacher) It's the school trip on Wednesday. You don't need to wear your school uniform or fashionable clothes. You need to wear cool and comfortable clothes, like some baggy shorts and a short-sleeved top.
- 6 (boy) This is my first school disco. What do people usually wear?
(girl) Well, I'm wearing my new patterned top and my flowery leggings. But maybe that isn't the right thing for you to wear!
(boy) No, I don't think so!
