

The following activities will help your students for the updated 2025 Madrid PAU Exam.

Reading T/F (with explanation from text)	Unit 3, p38, ex 4	Unit 3, p32, ex 4	<p>The Madrid PAU exam has an NG (not given) option, unlike these examples.</p> <p>Tell students to copy the part of the text which justifies their answer.</p> <p>For more practice of this question, you could use the tapescripts of the listening or video activities with T/F questions.</p>
Reading Open questions (without copying from text)	Unit 3, p38, ex 5 Unit 3, p47, ex 1	Unit 3, p33, ex 6	Remind students to answer in their own words and not to copy directly from the text.
Reading Vocabulary Find words in the text which mean... (definitions of given words)	Unit 3, p36, ex 2 Unit 3, p37, ex Aim Higher (students are asked to use the words given together with the word <i>change</i>) Unit 3, p38, ex 7 Unit 3, p42, ex 3	Unit 3, p33, ex 7	You could use these activities where students discuss the meaning of words in the reading texts or write definitions to practice synonym matching.

<p>Use of English Sentence transformations (without key word)</p>	<p>Unit 3, p40, ex 2 (Third Conditional) Unit 3, p41, ex Aim Higher B (inverted conditionals)</p>	<p>Unit 3, p30, ex 3 (mixed conditionals) Unit 3, p36, ex 4 (mixed conditionals)</p>	<p>You could use these exs for extra practice, although in the PAU test the key word is given, and the grammar point tested is not given, which makes the ex more challenging.</p>
<p>Writing A problem–solution essay</p>	<p>Unit 3, p44–45, exs 1–6</p>	<p>Unit 3, p35, exs 1–4</p>	<p>This genre does not appear in the current 2025 model, but it is good practice to be prepared for other genres which may appear. Tell students to write between 150 to 200 words.</p>
